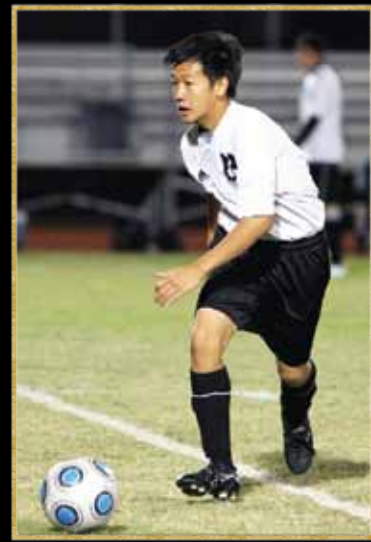


NORTHLAND Christian School

History

Northland Christian School (NCS) was founded in 1974. NCS offers a traditional college preparatory curriculum and comprehensive co-curricular programs. The beautiful campus is located in northwest Houston which is one of the fastest growing areas of the fourth largest US city. Currently there are 330 elementary students and 350 secondary students enrolled.

Global Perspective

NCS provides opportunities for students to experience the rich diversity of people, groups and cultures from all over the world. Our students have traveled to Italy, Spain, China, Peru, and Mexico. The growing international student population continues to expand the school's global perspective.

College Placement

- Guidance counselors meet individually with students to assist in the college admissions process.
- *Naviance*, a comprehensive college and career search program, is utilized by students throughout the college and career search process.
- SAT and ACT test preparation is available for all NCS students through Method Test Prep.
- 100% of graduating seniors are accepted at a college or university.
- 84% attend a four-year university; 16% attend a two-year university.
- Graduating seniors are awarded an average of \$2.5 million dollars in scholarships (average for the last 5 years).
- NCS graduates attend various colleges and universities including recent enrollment at The University of Texas at Austin, Texas A&M University, Rice University, Vanderbilt University, Stanford University, Baylor University, University of Oklahoma, College of William and Mary, Colorado State University, Bentley University, Pepperdine University, and New York University.
- Students are given opportunities to visit multiple colleges and universities.



Houston, Texas

- NCS is uniquely located in the beautiful northwest suburbs of Houston and is conveniently accessible to a wide range of metropolitan cultural experiences.

Graduation Requirements

- NCS works with each student to select challenging courses to satisfy requirements for either a Recommended or Distinguished Achievement High School Diploma.
- Approximately 35% of students meet the advanced measures required to be awarded the Distinguished Achievement Program diploma.
- NCS requires 30 total credits for graduation, surpassing the State of Texas requirement of 26.
- Community service hours are required to enhance social and academic learning while developing character and citizenship skills. Students are encouraged to exceed the minimum requirement of 20 hours per year.



College Preparation

- NCS students are encouraged to enroll in Dual Credit, Honors, and Advanced Placement level courses in Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Computer Science, Debate, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Humanities, Physics, Spanish, Studio Art, and US History.
- Typically, 77% of seniors are enrolled in Advanced Placement and/or Dual Credit courses.
- Approximately 60% of AP students score a 3 or higher on their AP exam.
- Teacher to student ratio is 1:13.
- Average class size is 20.



Facilities

Grades 6th-12th are situated on 33 acres which gives it the look and feel of a small college campus. Through the generosity of our donors, we have recently remodeled many of our buildings including all classrooms. The Science Building was renovated with state-of-the-art laboratories. Beautiful soccer, baseball, softball, and football fields, as well as a premier track and field running complex surround the campus. Nine additional acres of property were recently purchased for expansion.



Religious Affiliation

Northland Christian School is a private, non-denominational, Christian school. NCS believes that students should develop in the four areas that are stated in our mission statement. Our students regularly come from 30-40 different Christian churches. Bible classes focusing on Christian history, worldview, and doctrine are attended by all of our students as well as a weekly chapel service. Our international students attend church with their host family.





Co-Curricular Activities

Achievement is valued and excellence is encouraged through involvement in co-curricular activities. Students have the opportunity to use their God given gifts in the areas of academics, athletics, and fine arts. Students can use their academic talents through participation in debate and numerous academic competitions. Students who are gifted athletically can choose from 12 different sports. NCS Fine Arts programs are superior and offer students an environment in which they can thrive. Leadership opportunities are available through membership and participation in organizations such as the International Thespian Society, National Art Honor Society, National Forensic League, National Honor Society, and Student Council. We believe participation in our co-curricular programs offers students the opportunity to develop their whole person and enrich their educational journey.



Boarding Student Placement

The education of students at NCS is a partnership between the home and the school. Parents are highly involved in the education process. With this foundation, NCS offers a home stay program for our international students. Students have the opportunity to live with American families. Living with an American family 24/7 is an environment that fosters social and emotional growth. An added benefit is the enhancement of the international student's English skills as they are surrounded by English speaking natives on a daily basis.



Host families are carefully screened using background and reference checks. Families are interviewed, selected and then trained to meet the needs of each student. Special attention is given to ensure that each student is properly placed with a compatible host family.



International Student Personal Growth

An education at NCS is not an end in itself; it is a means employed in the development of character. Students will be held to high ethical and moral standards. Students will be challenged and encouraged to set short and long range goals for their lives. NCS faculty, staff, and host families will give students what is needed, not necessarily what is wanted. The NCS family will love students and expect great things from them.

One-to-One Laptop Program

Northland launched its Anytime Anywhere Learning Program (One-to-One Laptop Program) in 2006. The program enhances learning and teaching with technology and also embeds technology into the core curriculum. Each student in grades 6-12 has access to their own laptop with a comprehensive software package. International Boarding Student Tuition and Fee Information

Tuition/Fees: \$31,760

Includes:

- Tuition
- Enrollment Fee
- Home-stay, meals (includes on-campus lunch)
- MacBook computer (student is provided one computer during enrollment period at NCS)
- Health Insurance (\$2,500 Deductible – includes only those fees covered by insurance)
- Academic Counseling
- Textbooks
- Yearbook
- College Placement Services
- ESL support
- Technology fee
- Ground shuttle transportation to and from airport (flights are not included)
- All home-stays during holidays (Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter, Spring Break) and several day trips
- Does not include medical fees not covered by insurance.

Additional Estimated Costs May Include:

- Activity fees \$100 - \$150 (debate, choir and athletics)
- School uniform \$100 - \$150
- Choir uniform
- Class t-shirt
- Senior trip \$750 - \$900

Application Fee: \$500

Non-refundable, this includes the SEVIS I-901 fee of \$200.

Emergency Fund Fee: \$1,200

Any unused amount of this fund is returned to the student at the end of the school year.
Balance refunded to the student on June 10th.

Tuition Deposit: \$3,000

Due upon acceptance in order to secure the student's enrollment.

Payments:

Option 1 - One Payment due July 1st.

Option 2 - Two Payments – 70% of tuition due July 1st and remaining 30% due December 1st.

Termination of Contract Fee:

If a student does not enroll after payment of the tuition deposit, the \$3,000 deposit is non-refundable.

Refund Schedule:

Since all accounts with the school are due and payable on July 1st, the following refunds will be made to students who withdraw. Tuition and fees: 50% for an academic year in which classes have met for ten days or less. No refund for academic year in which classes have met for more than ten days. There will be no refunds for students who are dismissed for disciplinary reasons.
