Wednesday: HS & MS: a box of mac and cheese LS: canned pasta (like ravioli or spaghetti o's)


Thursday: HS and MS: two cans of soup or chili LS: a bottle of vegetable oil or a jar of applesauce

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
Economics Class

Academic-level Economics students were tasked with figuring out how to survive in a post-apocalyptic world. Their instructions: It's finally happened: the zombie apocalypse! That's right- you live in a post-apocalyptic world. Devastation surrounds you, broken infrastructure crumbles, communications are destroyed, and zombies roam. The population of your city has become so diminished that only about 1,000 people remain. You've secured a small area that you *think* is fairly safe from the zombies. The war is over, and it's time to rebuild. The people look to you to forge a bright future and a stable economy.

They had to draw a map of the city and figure out an economic plan, determine the type of the government & what level of government intervention, address the spiritual needs of their community, and problem-solve future concerns (they were given three possible scenarios that they might face, and they had to come up with a plan on how to do so). The lesson was a summative assessment of unit one's basic economic concept. Still, it added the Biblical integration component by asking students to address the emotional and spiritual well-being of their society as they survived the trauma, loss, and fear of the unknown.


The class was divided into groups of 5-6 students to complete the activity.

While in North Carolina, students also got to tour Duke University!




