

Classes are partnering with our 5th-graders to serve as writing buddies. They review, edit, and share ideas with our 5th-grade authors. We have had secondary guest readers visit our preschool classes. We are looking forward to possibly piloting a tutoring/study buddy program to pair high school students with middle and elementary students for after-school homework help or tutoring. This program would give our secondary students an important opportunity to develop their leadership skills, earn service hours or some extra cash, while creating a cost-effective method for getting elementary and middle school students quality tutoring.
