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**ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT - Rachael (Sherwin) Carter**  
**(Class of 1997)**

Rachael (Sherwin) Carter attended Northland from the age of two until she graduated from high school in 1997. After graduating from Northland in 1997, Rachael attended college at Abilene Christian University where she reunited with Brad Carter, her future husband, whom she originally met at church camp. After graduating from ACU in 2001, Brad and Rachael married and began life in Abilene where Rachael worked on a Master's degree. Shortly after, God introduced His plan for the Carter family and they added three beautiful daughters (Elie, Caroline, and Annie) over the following years.

In May of 2012, Rachael and Brad answered the Lord's call and moved, along with their three young girls, to Swaziland (now Eswatini) in Africa where Brad served as the president of African Christian College. Rachael served faithfully beside him for twelve years teaching classes on campus and as an encourager to the entire ACC community. During that time, Rachael was best known for scheduling reading times with the children of students on campus. She also taught students organic practices, sustainability, and created the Locavore Farmer's Market. This market sells organic produce, fresh baked goods, homemade ice cream, and handmade items. Another product sold at the market is macadamia honey from the macadamia orchard on campus. This orchard is a primary source of tuition funding for students and they all work together to maintain and harvest the macadamia nuts to help cover tuition costs and expenses. Rachael and Brad

returned to Texas in December of 2024 to oversee the processing and distribution of the macadamia products. The products of their labor are sold online under the label Ukwazi Macadamia as well as in the bulk nut sections of HEB and Central Market stores.

The Sherwin family has a long and rich history at Northland. Rachael's sister, Amy, is a graduate of the class of 1986 and her brother, Jonathan, attended for a time as well. Some of you likely remember Rachael's parents, Woody and Lovee Sherwin. Lovee began teaching at Northland in 1977 and was a beloved preschool teacher for many years. In addition to teaching, Lovee also developed our Pre-K program, served as Early Childhood Director, and computerized the Elementary library. Lovee wrapped up her 29.5 years of faithful service to Northland by teaching computer classes to our 3rd-5th grade classes.

Though Woody has received his heavenly reward and Lovee has retired to Abilene to be near Amy and her family, the Sherwin family will always remain a treasured piece of Northland's history. They are wonderful examples of how servant leadership and the Northland community work to change the lives of students and families for eternity - even in Eswatini, Africa.

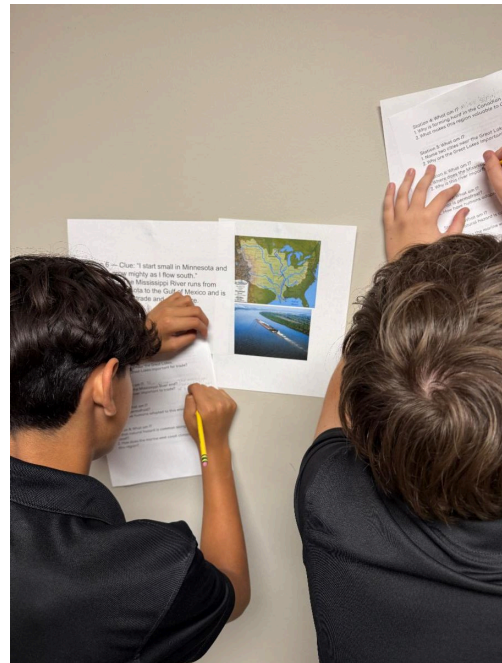
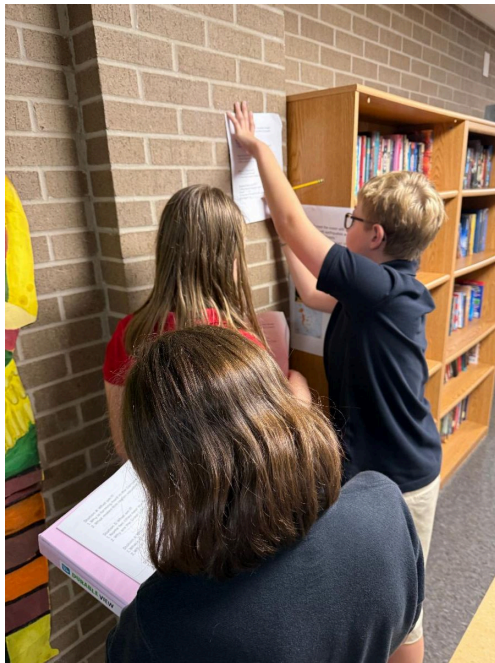




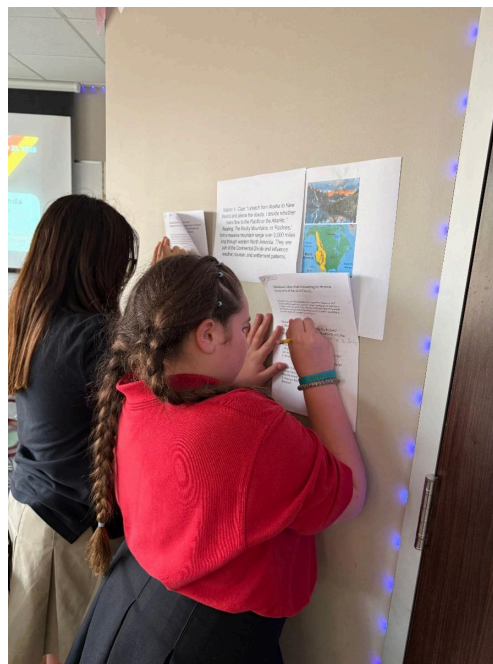
## Social Studies Statues and Gallery Walk

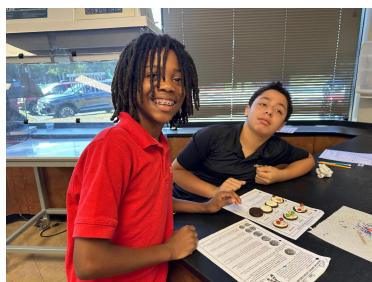






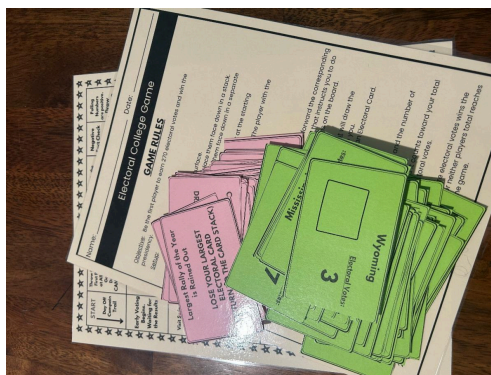
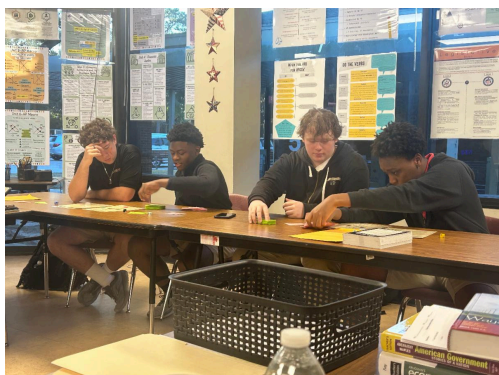
## Growing Smarter by Snacking in Science

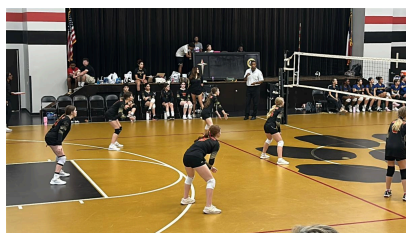


## Middle School Volleyball
